

THE EARLY YEARS AT FREMONT ALLIANCE CHURCH



The Fremont Alliance Church had its beginnings in the radio ministry of Dr. R. R. Brown of the Omaha Gospel Tabernacle. Mr. Fred Davis of Fremont heard Dr. Brown's broadcast, went to Omaha in person and began to take friends to hear the radio preacher.

Evangelistic meetings were held in tents several times in summers in 1927 and 1928 with Dr. R. R. Brown and other evangelists that he supplied. Out of this grew home Bible studies and prayer meetings.

On June 23, 1932, the believers were organized as a branch of the Christian and Missionary Alliance. A year later in 1933, land was purchased at 521 N. H St. and the Tabernacle was built with the dedication in June of 1933. The church was birthed by sacrificial efforts on the part of the pastor and members. Services were held on a dirt floor, with a wood-burning heater at the front with wood donated to heat the church.

In April of 1951 the congregation purchased the Christian Church building on the corner of 8th and C St. where we worshipped until the summer of 1963 when our new building was completed at the corner of 16th St. & Lincoln Ave. This building was dedicated on November 20, 1963.
